

## What does LEAP stand for?

LEAP stands for Louisiana Educational Assessment Program and is the standardized test conducted at the end of the year in every public school in Louisiana.

## Who takes the LEAP test?

All 3rd-8th grade students.

## When will students take the LEAP test this year?

All students will take the Computer Based Tests (CBT).

Grades 3-5: May 6 to 12 (with May 13 and 14 to make up missed tests).

Grades 6-8: May 13 to 19 (with May 20 and 21 to make up missed tests).

## How many sessions are there for each LEAP test and what is the duration of each session?

The schedule varies slightly for each grade: (SC=science, SS=social studies, ELA=English, Mth=math)

## What will students do during the rest of the day?

Students have a modified school day after testing. You will receive information from your child's homeroom teacher/advisor for specific changes to your child's schedule.

## How are the performance levels assessed in the Louisiana Educational Assessment Program (LEAP)?

Louisiana Educational Assessment Program (LEAP) performance level indicators are

- Advanced
- Mastery
- Basic
- Approaching Basic
- Unsatisfactory

## When are scores received?

Usually scores are received by the school in late June (after school has ended). Individual student scores are given to parents in August at our first Back to School meeting for the next school year.

## What are LEAP scores used for? What happens if my child does not “pass” LEAP?

LEAP scores are used by the LDOE to evaluate ISL as a school. Every school is evaluated by the LDOE based on their students' progress toward a target score they set for each child at the beginning of the year. ISL is awarded points based on the student's level of achievement for each test area. When a student does not test, it reflects as a zero in the progress measure, as if the child did not make any academic progress at all that year.
